A beloved husband, father, brother in law, and friend, Glenn R. Murray, 55 of Millville, NJ was born into Eternal Rest on January 12, 2015 at Capital Trauma Hospital in Trenton with family by his side.

From his birth in Woodbine, NJ on September 5, 1959 to his death on Monday, his kindness and generosity towards others was always given in the Christian spirit. He was born in Woodbine to the late Leon and Joan (Carol) Murray and was one of five siblings.

In his early years, he enjoyed playing football and later became a Little League Coach sharing his passion and knowledge of the sport. In high school, he also played basketball and ran track and field. He graduated from Millville High School and continued his studies and received his license in the HVACR field. In recent years he grew a passion for woodworking. His projects ranged from crafts to furniture. 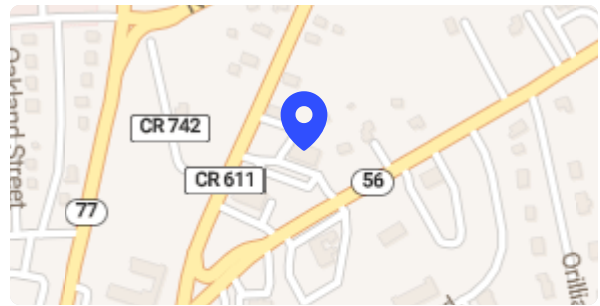

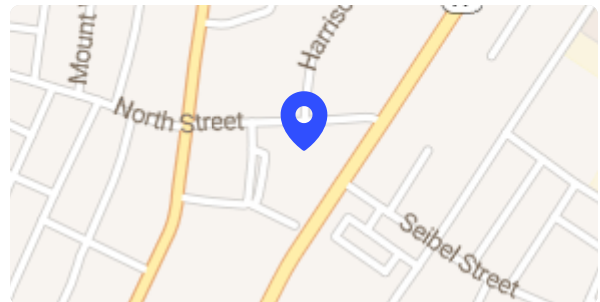

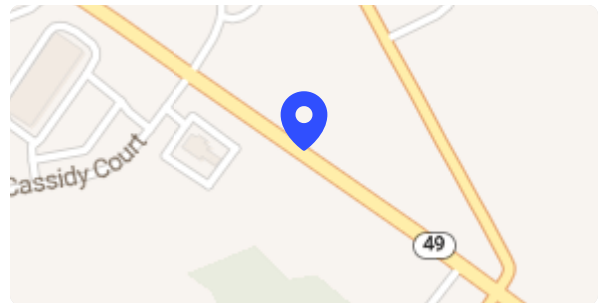
