William E. Goldsboro, aged 87 years of Vineland and formerly of Pittsgrove Twp., passed away early Wednesday morning February 8, 2017 in the NJ Memorial Veterans Home, Vineland.

Born in Gouldtown to the late Frank and Rebecca (nee Loatman) Goldsboro, he was the husband of the late Dorothy Goldsboro who passed in 2007.

Bill worked in the construction field for over 50 years and was an Operating Engineer and Truck Driver for Lavari Trucking in Vineland. 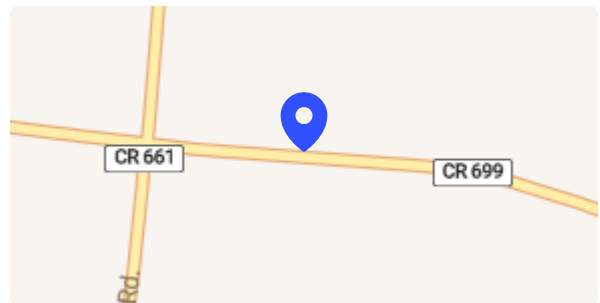
