At Cindy's request, there will be no funeral services. Cremation and inurnment of the cremains took place in the Camden County Crematory, Waterford Twp..




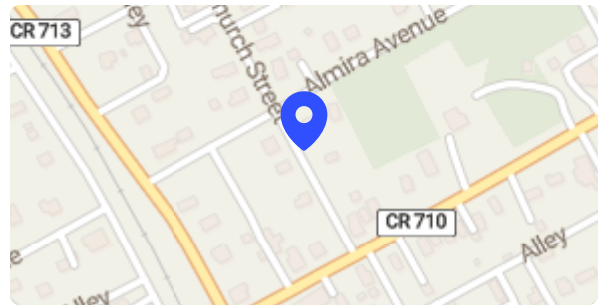
