Born in Bridgeton, March 1, 1929 the daughter of the late Joseph and Elsie nee Waddington DelCollo, she had been a resident of Fairfield Twsp. for forty eight years before moving to Fortescue where she has resided the past thirty years prior to her death.

She was a graduate of Bridgeton High School, and was formerly employed for over thirty years with National Freight Inc. of Vineland working in the Customer Service Department until her retirement in 2001. Ms. DelCollo was a twenty year breast cancer survivor. She was an avid fan of Philadelphia sports teams and enjoyed watching the Phillies, Sixers, Flyers, and her Eagles games. She was a long time active member of St. Andrews Episcopal Church in Bridgeton, where she served as a Sunday School teacher and Church School Superintendent.
