Rudolph Badger, 71 of Cedarville, passed away early Monday morning in Inspira Medical Center Vineland. He had been in declining health for the past few years. 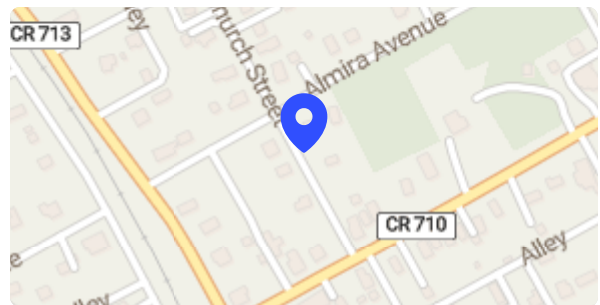
