A Memorial Service will be held on Monday evening June 5, at 5:00 pm from the Transformation Church 424 Indian Ave Bridgeton NJ

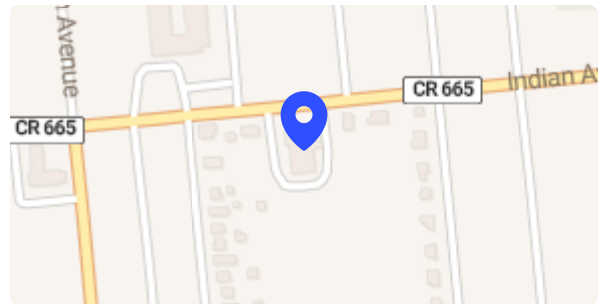

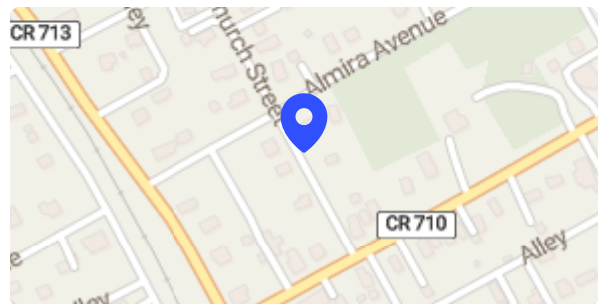
